

# YUFE Mobility Star

## Factsheet

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## General description

The Mobility Star is a digital certificate awarded to students who engage in physical or virtual mobility through academic courses or extracurricular activities.

Its main goal is to encourage them to gain international experience as part of their education and to seek interaction with different cultures and mindsets.

## Activities

The Mobility Star can be obtained either through:

### A) Academic activities:

- a) physical mobility (enrolling in and completing academic courses) at another YUFE university.
- b) virtual mobility (enrolling in and completing online academic or language courses) at another YUFE university.

### B) Non-academic activities:

- a) Civic Engagement activities part of the Civic Star.
- b) Professional activities part of the Professional Star.
- c) Language learning activities part of the Language Star.

## Workload and requirements

To be rewarded, you will need to have successfully completed, within the timeframe of OpenYUFE:

### 1. Either:

- 7 ECTS through physical or virtual courses at a YUFE university other than your own.
- Or 1 Civic, Language or Professional Star, through activities offered by a YUFE university other than your own.

2. The **Reflection Report** (step 1 & step 2), in the Virtual Campus: go to 'My Account > Rewards > Mobility Star'.
